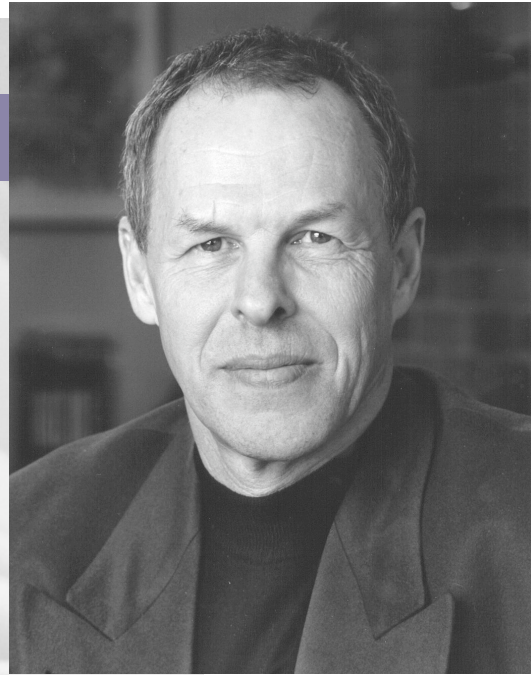


LINDEN MACINTYRE

Linden MacIntyre is a Nova Scotia-born journalist, broadcaster and novelist. He has won nine Gemini Awards, an International Emmy and numerous other awards for writing and journalistic excellence. He is the recipient of the Edna Staebler Award for Creative Non-Fiction and the Evelyn Richardson Prize for Non-Fiction for his boyhood memoir "Causeway: A Passage from Innocence." His most recent novel "The Bishop's Man" won the Scotiabank Giller Prize (2009). The prize jury called MacIntyre's book "a brave novel, conceived and written with impressive delicacy and understanding." He resides in Toronto where he is the co-host of CBC's weekly newsmagazine *The Fifth Estate* and a frequent guest host of *The Current* on CBC Radio One.
